SUMMER PROGRAMS

The Day Camp - Entering K-7th



The Day Camp at Paradise Farm Camps gives children the chance to explore the outdoors, make friends, and grow in a supportive environment close to home. Each day is packed with fun and adventure, swimming, nature hikes, arts and crafts, sports, camp games, and team-building activities.

Campers are grouped by age, allowing them to experience activities that are developmentally appropriate while still being challenged to try new things. With an emphasis on teamwork, respect, kindness, and enthusiasm, The Day Camp helps children build confidence, discover new interests, and end each day with a sense of accomplishment and joy.

Overnight Camp - Ages 9-15



Overnight Camp is a chance to deepen friendships, gain independence, and experience the wonder of sleeping under the stars. Living in cabins with peers and trained counselors, campers build community and confidence through shared adventures.

Days are active with swimming, archery, canoeing, nature exploration, and camp-wide games, while evenings bring campfires, songs, challenges and traditions that connect generations of campers. With the perfect balance of structure and freedom, Overnight Camp helps campers grow in patience, integrity, responsibility, and empathy.

Tiny Trek ½ Day - Entering K



Perfect for our youngest campers, the Tiny Trek Program introduces children to the magic of camp in a shorter, half-day format. Designed for first time campers entering Kindergarten, Tiny Trek focuses on gentle exploration, creative play, and building comfort in the camp environment.

Campers enjoy age-appropriate activities such as nature walks, arts and crafts, story time, games, splash play, and swim lessons all guided by nurturing staff who understand the needs of young children. This program helps campers gain independence, develop social skills, and experience the joy of camp, all in a shortened day format.

OVERVIEW



Teen Leadership - Ages 13-15

Our Teen Leadership Program is designed for young people who are ready to take the next step on their camp journey. This experience combines the fun of camp with opportunities to grow through interactive leadership lessons, hands-on service projects, and exciting offsite trips.

Participants dive into topics such as communication, problem-solving, servant leadership, and teamwork, all while practicing skills that prepare them for future success at camp, in school, and in their communities. Whether working together to complete a service project, exploring new challenges on an offsite adventure, or reflecting on personal goals, teens gain confidence, responsibility, and the tools to make a positive impact as leaders.

Rover's Club - Ages 5-15



We realize that when summer camp is over, many campers still need a fun and safe space to play, explore, connect, and grow. Rover's Club is just that place, with a program built upon the concept of **"Guided Choice, Endless Possibilities"**



Each morning campers create their experience by selecting from several exciting electives. Campers can choose a different elective each day, or can focus on a single passion throughout the week. The elective activities will be different each day, but will always be in one of four interest areas: Art, Sports, Nature, and Adventure. When the morning workshops have finished all of Rover's Club will come back together for lunch, swim, and an all-club activity.

Counselor in Training (CIT)



CIT I - Former campers who have aged out of our camp programs and local teens are invited to apply for our exciting Counselor In Training program. A volunteer opportunity that teaches the leadership skills and youth development principles that make great camp counselors.

CIT II - Level 2 CITs will build on the foundational skills learned at Level 1. These CIT's will spend all summer learning the youth development and mentoring qualities that make our staff so amazing. These CIT's are eligible to earn a stipend and a job offer upon completion.





DAY CAMP AT

At Paradise Farm Camps, Day Camp is more than just summer fun, it's a place where children learn, grow, and thrive. Surrounded by 600 acres of woods, fields, and streams, campers spend their days exploring, swimming, creating, and playing while building confidence and independence in a safe, supportive environment.

Guided by our core values of TREK—Teamwork, Respect, Enthusiasm, and Kindness—campers develop strong character, meaningful friendships, and a lasting sense of belonging. Whether trying archery for the first time, splashing in the pool, or discovering streamside critters, every child finds a welcoming space to explore and be proudly themselves.



Growth Through Mastery

Campers seeking an extra challenge can participate in our Mastery Program, designed to help them set goals, practice new skills, and celebrate progress in four content areas: Canoeing, Fishing, Archery, and Outdoor Living. Each area offers opportunities to achieve success through hands-on learning and personal accomplishment, building confidence, perseverance, and a deeper connection to the outdoors. As campers advance through the levels, they gain a true sense of pride in their achievements and a lifelong love of learning through experience.

Each child is placed into a cabin group based on the grade they will enter in the fall, ensuring they're surrounded by peers at a similar stage of growth and independence. These cabin groups are then organized into our Junior, Day, and Teen Units, each crafted around developmental milestones. From hands-on exploration and guided play for our youngest campers to increased responsibility, choice, and adventure for our older groups, every unit provides the right blend of structure, challenge, and fun. This intentional design helps every camper build confidence, connect with new friends, and thrive in a program tailored to their unique needs.

Camp Meals

At Paradise Farm Camps, meals are more than just a time to eat—they're a time to come together. Pick-Up & Drop-Off

Pick-up and drop-off for Overnight Camp are designed to be smooth, safe, and welcoming for all families. At drop-off, staff will greet campers, assist with luggage, and help them get settled into their cabins so they can begin building connections right away. At pick-up, families are invited to reconnect with their campers, meet counselors, and hear about the week’s adventures. Clear signage, designated parking areas, and supportive staff ensure the process is efficient and stress-free from start to finish.

Cabin Life

Cabin life at Overnight Camp is at the heart of the camper experience, offering a warm, supportive community where friendships grow naturally. Each camper will live in a cabin with 5–6 other campers their age and one dedicated counselor who guides the group, fosters connection, and ensures everyone feels included and cared for. Cabins become a home base for rest, reflection, and laughter—whether sharing stories before lights-out, preparing for the day’s activities, or enjoying quiet downtime together. This small-group setting helps campers build strong bonds, develop independence, and feel a true sense of belonging.

The Teen Leadership Program is designed for campers ages 13–15 who are ready to grow as leaders and make a meaningful impact within the camp community. Through hands-on experiences and mentorship, participants develop key leadership skills such as communication, teamwork, and problem-solving while embracing the values of empathy, integrity, and respect.

Centered on the idea of servant leadership, the program teaches that true leadership comes from supporting others and using personal strengths to help the group succeed. By leading activities, collaborating with peers, and reflecting on their experiences, teens gain confidence, purpose, and a lasting understanding of how leadership rooted in service can create positive change at camp and beyond.



Leadership Discussions

During Leadership Discussions, campers dive into facilitated talks into topics such as communication styles, conflict resolution, ethical decision-making, and servant leadership in action. These conversations provide a safe space to share experiences, ask questions, and learn from peers and mentors alike. Participants leave with stronger critical thinking skills, understanding leadership principles, and confidence in guiding others with empathy and integrity.



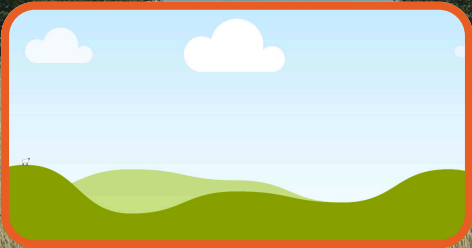
Service Learning Projects

A cornerstone of the program is the service project, where campers identify a need within the camp or local community and work together to make a positive impact. This experience teaches collaboration, initiative, and creative problem-solving, while reinforcing the principles of servant leadership. Teens see firsthand how their efforts can benefit others, and they develop a lasting appreciation for giving back and leading with purpose.



Off-Site Trip

The off-site trip offers campers the chance to explore new environments, challenge themselves, and practice leadership in real-world settings. These adventures emphasize teamwork, adaptability, and decision-making, helping teens step confidently into leadership roles outside of their usual surroundings. Each trip combines fun and learning with meaningful opportunities to reflect on personal growth and group dynamics.

Camp Activities Highlights



Nature

Campers immerse themselves in the beauty and excitement of the natural world as they hike trails, observe wildlife, and investigate the plants and animals around them. Hands-on activities encourage curiosity and discovery, helping campers learn about ecosystems, conservation, and the changing seasons while developing an appreciation for the environment. From tracking animal signs to exploring forests and meadows, every day is an opportunity for adventure in nature.



Adventure

Adventure awaits around every corner with activities that challenge campers to step outside their comfort zones. Through climbing, archery, canoeing, and other outdoor adventures campers build courage, resilience, and confidence while enjoying high-energy experiences. Adventure activities encourage problem-solving, teamwork, and personal growth, giving every camper the thrill of accomplishment and the joy of discovery.



Swimming

Campers make a splash while developing water skills, confidence, and safety awareness in a fun and supervised environment. Daily swim ensures every camper enjoys time in the water. Junior campers receive 60 minutes of structured swim lessons each week, helping them improve technique and gain confidence under the guidance of certified instructors. Swimming at camp is both exciting and educational, providing a refreshing way to stay active while having fun.



Sports

Campers stay active and energized with a wide variety of sports designed for all skill levels. From team games like soccer, basketball, and capture-the-flag to individual challenges and skill-building activities, campers develop coordination, teamwork, and sportsmanship. Every activity is designed to be fun and inclusive, giving each camper the chance to grow, compete in a friendly way, and celebrate their achievements with friends.



STEAM & Crafts

Our STEAM and crafts program sparks creativity, imagination, and critical thinking in campers of all ages. Through hands-on projects in science, technology, engineering, art, and math, campers experiment, design, and create in ways that inspire learning and problem-solving. From building structures and conducting experiments to painting, crafting, and innovating, campers get to explore their ideas and see the results of their creativity come to life.



Day Camp Activities

- **Electives:**
 - Campers have the opportunity to pick from theme specific activities that are outside of the normal day camp schedule.
- **Swim Lessons**
 - Junior Campers will have a 20 minute swim lesson led by our waterfront team before free swim Tuesday - Thursday.
- **Friday Activity**
 - Every Friday, the camp community comes together for a large scale activity that relates to the theme.
- **Specialists**
 - Cabin groups will see four specialists throughout the week, Nature, Adventure, Sports & STEAM
- **Imagination Station**
 - Once a week campers have the opportunity to create whatever they would like in the imagination stations. Legos, costumes and a stage, art supplies and books are available to them!



Overnight Camp Activities

- **Offsite Trip**
 - In the middle of the week, the camp whole camp goes on an adventure trip off camp property
- **Nighttime Activities**
 - Each night, the whole camp gathers together for a nighttime activity such as glow in the dark tag or a solving a mystery.
- **Meal time**
 - Every meal is spent together as a community in a family style meal.
- **Optional Morning Activities**
 - Before the camp day begins, campers have the option of taking part in a morning activity like hiking or swimming.
- **Camp Challenges**
 - Before dinner each day, the campers and staff are challenged to a teambuilding activity.



DAY CAMP THEMES

We understand that the cost of camp can feel out of reach, which is why we set aside spaces in our Day Camp, Teen Leadership Program, and Tiny Trek program, along with nearly half the bunks at Overnight Camp, for families in need of financial assistance.

Families who apply for financial assistance are matched with a sliding scale that takes both income and family size into account. This helps us provide the right level of support, with sponsorships that may cover a portion—or even the full cost—of camp tuition (excluding a small registration fee).

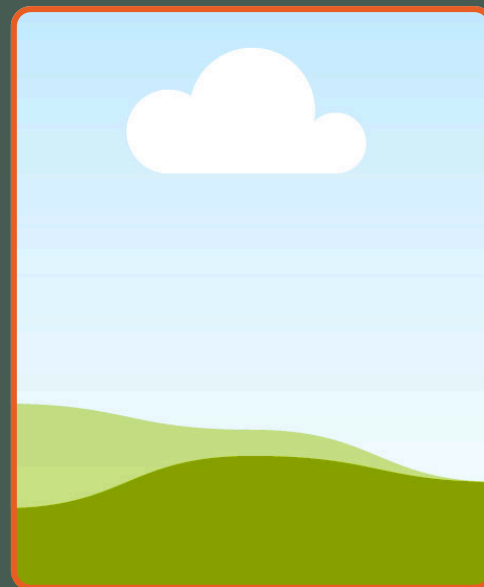
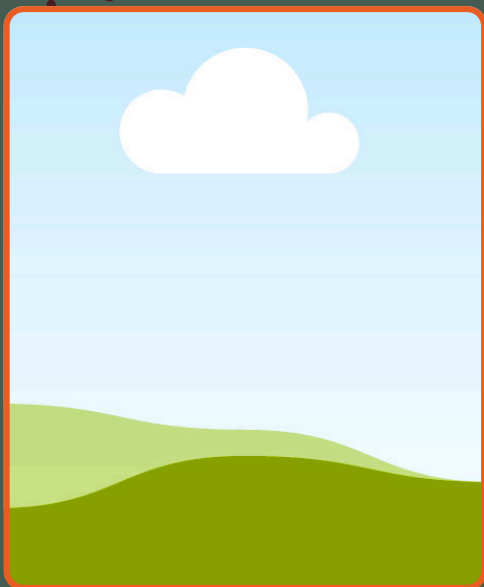

Counselors In Training (CIT)



This Program gives motivated teens the chance to step into real leadership while still enjoying the magic of camp. CITs build practical skills, gain hands-on experience working with younger campers, and grow their confidence through guided mentorship. It's the perfect next step for teens ready to make an impact and become the leaders others look up to.

CIT I

The CIT I program introduces first-year teens to the core skills of leadership, teamwork, and camper support. Over the course of four immersive weeks, CITs rotate through activity areas, learn behavior-management basics, and practice leading alongside experienced staff. It's a structured, supportive first step that builds confidence and prepares them for greater responsibility.

CIT II

Second-year participants step into a deeper, more hands-on leadership role as part of the CIT II program. These teens commit to the full summer season, taking on increased responsibilities with groups and activities while receiving ongoing mentorship from senior staff. CIT II's also earn a paid stipend, reflecting their dedication, skill growth, and vital contribution to the camp community.

Teamwork & Collaboration – Working effectively within counselor teams to support activities, transitions, and camp life.
